Jim Gordon is a 4th generation woolgrower from Young NSW who is extremely passionate about the Late Dr Jim Watts's research. He has conducted his own extensive research to further create a clear picture for wool growers at their level with an extensive understanding of the role skins play on fibre quality and the resilience of the animals. Jim will talk about skin biology and wool quality.

Dr Jason Trompf from Lambs Alive has been working as Agricultural Consultant for over 20 years. Jason works nationally and has had significant input into the design, delivery and evaluation of a range of farm management programs including the Triple P Program, Lifetime Ewe Management and Bred Well Fed Well for both sheep and beef.
